ADA FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS –

24/7 Fire Department Coverage Begins

After over a year of planning the Fire Department is ready to implement staffing of our Fire Station One on a 24 hour basis. This is a change from the Monday – Friday 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. coverage we have had for the past 20+ years. An addition for sleeping quarters and day room were recently completed to accommodate the new staffing plan. A selection committee has selected two of our paid on call members to fill these positions. Brandon Holmes and Ken Remijn, along with current full-time firefighter, Nick Dewey, will now fill these new shifts. Our dedicated, paid, on call members will work closely with this team adding additional staffing evenings, weekends and filling vacation shifts. Our response times will improve by several minutes, especially during the after 5:00 p.m. hours when our members previously were responding from their homes to the station. Thank you for supporting our Public Safety Millage that allows us to improve the service we offer to our residents and visitors.

NEWS FROM KENT COUNTY SHERIFF OFFICE –

Happy New Year. As we begin the new year, I would like to take a minute to reflect on traffic. This reflection may seem sobering at first, but I promise it will make a good point in the end. The NHTSA (National Highway Traffic Safety Administration) keeps statistics on vehicle collisions each year. The following statistics are from their website. In 2016 (2016 is the most recent year published) there were 7,277,000 traffic crashes reported to police nationwide. Of those crashes, 3,144,000 resulted in injury and 37,461 resulted in fatalities. Last year the East Precinct (Ada, Cascade and Grand Rapids Townships) had 1,533 reported crashes with 4 total fatalities.



I regularly receive calls and emails regarding traffic complaints throughout the East Precinct. These complaints revolve mostly around speed, stop sign violations, and school bus passing. Most of the complaints are in residential speed zones (neighborhoods). When I conduct selective enforcement in these areas, the most common excuse I receive from the

drivers is “I’m in a hurry”. It is important to remember that a vehicle has the same potential for serious damage as any other dangerous weapon. When drivers drive too fast, or are not paying attention, the results can be deadly.

So, I want to challenge everyone as we start a new year (think community wide New Year’s resolution). Please think twice before you race through a residential street or pass a stopped school bus with its flashers activated. Avoid distractions by putting your cell phone away while driving. If you have a hard time avoiding the temptation of cell phone usage, think of placing it in the glove box or trunk while driving. And always wear your seatbelt! Remember, the consequences for these actions can be far worse than just a citation from your friendly community officer.

ELECTIONS –

The passage of Proposal 3 from the November 2018 election will affect all future elections in Michigan. At this time the State is working on procedures and forms to comply with these new laws.



In simple form, here are the most basic changes you will notice:

- Change in voter registration deadlines. There is no longer a 30-day advance requirement for registration. Mail registration must now be done 15 days before the election. Some voters may register up to and on Election Day. Watch for more information on this.
- No reason absentee voting. Anyone may now request an absentee ballot without declaring a “reason.”
- Straight-party voting. You may now check one box on your ballot to vote for all races for your party of choice.

At this time we are anticipating a May election . . . only for those in the Lowell School District. More information to follow . . .

The market continues to be successful because of the collaboration among vendors, volunteers, shoppers, and local retailers. A library in Ada?

Ada Township Hall, April 20, 1966. The township offices, the Ada Fire Department and a library shared this building on the north corner of Ada Dr. and Thornapple River Dr. beginning in 1948. The Hall was rented out for events like wedding showers, receptions and even tap dance lessons.

Back in 1936, two local women started Ada's Kent County Rural Library in the old township offices. By 1940, the Ada Ladies Literary Club was in charge and paid Librarian Grace Whaley a handsome salary of \$10/month. Wonder how the librarian felt about that tap dancing.

UPDATE ON THE NEW SETTLER'S PARK

The new "Settler's Park", located along the banks of the Thornapple River in the Village, is nearing completion. The final construction phases will start back up in March and continue into the summer. This includes restoration work along the riverbank, trail work and the stage area. Please be careful in the area while construction continues and supervise children in the playground and near the river. The fundraising campaign is still underway. ROSELLE PARK – PUBLIC HEARING MARCH 11
