CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

As fall arrives, so do the cooler temperatures which means we will be closing doors and windows and starting the furnace. The colder months also increase the chances of carbon monoxide poisoning. Carbon monoxide is an odorless gas emitted from fuel fired appliances such as gas stoves, water heaters and furnaces. If any of these appliances are faulty, they can omit carbon monoxide which can be fatal. Prepare your home with a CO detector and keep your family safe. These detectors simply plug into an electrical outlet and monitor CO levels.



ADA DRIVE INTERSECTION PROJECT PLANNED TO IMPROVE PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICLE SAFETY

After hearing from many residents regarding traffic visibility issues at the Ada Drive/Thornapple River Dr. intersection, and concerns about vehicle speed and pedestrian safety in the Village, the Township Board has given approval for installation of curb “bumpouts” and traffic lane adjustments at the Ada Drive/Thornapple River Dr. and Ada Drive/Bronson St. intersections, to be completed by this fall.

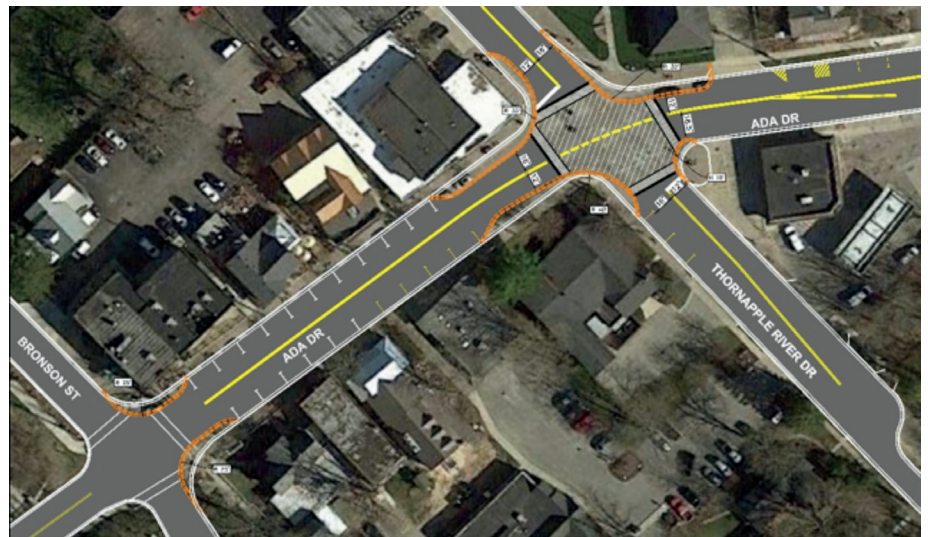
The curb bumpouts will establish defined “no parking” zones along Ada Drive at the two intersections, providing drivers on Thornapple River Dr. and Bronson St. with a better view of traffic before proceeding through the intersections. The bumpouts will also create safer conditions for pedestrians crossing Ada Drive, by shortening the crosswalk distance. Based on documented experience in other communities, the bumpouts will also result in slower vehicle speeds through the Village on Ada Drive.

Separate left turn lanes from Ada Drive onto Thornapple River Drive will also be removed as part of this project. Left turns will continue to be accommodated from a single traffic lane in each direction on Ada Drive.

The project will result in a net addition of 5-7 parking spaces in the Village. Two spaces will be removed from Ada Drive in front of the Godwin Ada Hardware, while 5 spaces will be added on the opposite side of the street, between the Ada Barber Shop and Thornapple River Dr. An additional 2-4 parking spaces will be added

on Ada Drive and Thornapple River Dr., across the street from the Speedway station.

The Township is also aware of traffic backup issues on Thornapple River Dr. at Headley St. entering the Village from the south during morning and afternoon commute times. This problem pre-dates the street changes that have occurred in the Village in the last few years. Analysis of traffic patterns indicates that the afternoon backup is caused, in part, by traffic backups on Ada Drive at the Fulton St. intersection, with traffic frequently backing up all the way to the Headley St. signal. Adjustments to signal timing at the Ada Drive/Fulton St. intersection are being requested of the Michigan DOT to help alleviate this problem.



Planned Intersection Improvements on Ada Drive.

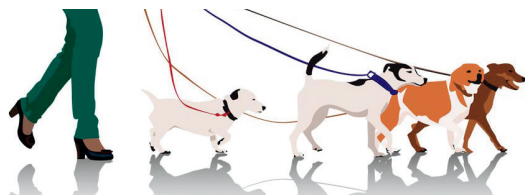
SOS REAL ID

Beginning October 1, 2020, Michigan residents will need to present a REAL ID-compliant driver’s license or state ID card to fly within the United States and enter certain federal facilities under federal law.

To obtain a REAL ID-compliant license or ID, residents will need to bring in a valid U.S. passport or certified birth certificate with a raised seal or stamp to any **Secretary of State** office. If your name is different from what’s on your birth certificate, you will need to bring in a certified name-change document, such as your marriage license or court order.

Compliant cards are marked with a star inside a gold circle on the upper right. There is no extra fee for a REAL ID-compliant card unless people apply for one outside of their normal renewal cycle.

FOR: Ada and Cascade Township residents. Identification is required to verify your residency within the townships of Ada or Cascade. If you live in Grand Rapids Township, but your mailing address is Ada, you do not qualify.



WHEN: Saturday, October 27, 2018 from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Gates close sharply at 2:30.

WHERE: Forest Hills Central Middle School parking lot
ONE WAY ENTRY FROM ADA DRIVE, EXIT HALL DRIVE.
Enter via Ada Drive near Alta Dale by Central Middle School.

WHAT: Non-hazardous household waste, appliances, scrap metal, electronics for recycling (computers, TV's, etc.), household items for re-use, office paper for shredding.

NO YARD WASTE. You will need to use leaf pick-up day, your curb side service or other source for yards waste such as leaves, branches and brush.

NO HAZARDOUS MATERIAL such as paint (open and dried paint cans okay), cleaners, batteries or other hazardous material will be accepted.

Services on Site:



Republic Services: For general trash and junk, appliances, scrap metal. No yard waste.



Salvation Army: For used or new household items such as furniture, kitchen items and clothes. Donation receipts available.



Shred-it: For shedding of office paper, personal files and other documents. Up to 100 lbs. of personal sensitive documents.



Comprenew: For electronic items such as computers, televisions and small appliances, cell phones, household batteries. (Large appliances are accepted by Republic Services.)

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF DAY – SafeChem Collection

Date: Saturday, October 27, 2018

Time: 8:00 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.

Location: Cascade Fire Station
2990 Buttrick Ave SE., Cascade, MI

This is an opportunity to safely remove and dispose of unwanted hazardous materials from your home. It is for households in Kent County only, not businesses.

BRING: oil-based paint and thinner, fertilizers, pool and photo chemicals, bug spray and weed killer, fluorescent tubes and CFL bulbs, cleaning products, fire extinguishers, gasoline, antifreeze, motor oil, mercury thermostat and thermometer, aerosol cans.

DO NOT BRING: latex paint, alkaline batteries, medication, needles, fireworks, ammunition, propane, tires, containers larger than 5-gallons, business and non-Kent County wastes

It is recommended to keep "like" containers together. Do not mix the waste with other materials. Maintain labeling so it can be clearly seen. Any leaking or potentially dangerous chemicals should be placed in a bucket for secondary containment. It is recommended to place all items upright in a lined box and/or a plastic tote. You may transport vehicle fluids (oil, gas, antifreeze) in original/approved containers as fluids can be bulked and containers returned to resident.

DON'T TIRE OF RECYCLING!

Not only is there an economic impact to recycling tires, but a social and environmental one too! Courtland Township is hosting a one day event for northeast Kent County area residents to recycle up to 10 tires for FREE. Convenient and economical disposal of scrap tires is essential in the fight to prevent illegal dumping and to prevent the spread of mosquito-borne illnesses. Additionally, tires collected through this event will NOT go to the landfill and instead will be recycled.

Residents can bring 10 tires per vehicle. All tires must be off the rims and in "clean" condition. We will be accepting passenger tires only (car, SUV, or pickup truck). Semi, tractor or loader tires are not accepted. The event is being held at Courtland Township Hall on September 15, 2018 from 8:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

FACILITY USE

Park Hours: Park grounds are open dawn to dusk, some parking lots don't open until 7:00 a.m.

Dog Policy: Township ordinances require dogs to be on a leash and cleaned up after in all parks.

Motorized recreation vehicles are not allowed.

Alcohol is not allowed in the parks or park facilities.

Walking & Bike Paths: Located throughout the Township and the Parks. Maps available.

Facility Reservations and Rentals: Contact the Park office for scheduling and fees.

Ada Park Shelter & Gazebo: Available April - October. 2019 reservation will begin December 1st.

Roselle Park Meeting Room: Available on a limited basis for education programs, non-profit groups, Ada community groups and local businesses.

Athletic Fields: For public use, area leagues and instructional programs.

Tennis & Pickleball Courts: At Ada Park, reservations available, otherwise open to public except during scheduled programs.

ADA TOWNSHIP PARK

The renovation of our old tennis courts into four new tennis courts and six pickleball courts is now complete. We are grateful to everyone that provided support of this project, especially Jerry and Marcy Tubergen. Several courts are being kept open for drop-in play, while others are available for reservations. Contact the Park office for details.

As another park improvement project this season, we are doing repairs to the cracks in the paved path through the Arboretum section of the park. We will also be re-doing the path along Buttrick Drive.



ROSELLE PARK

This season we will be working on improving the non-paved trail system in the north part of the park. We hope this will make the trail more accessible.

NEW RIVERSIDE PARK may get a new name

The new park along Thornapple River in the Village is coming closer to completion. The street-side work is done, including the parking, restroom, playground and adjacent "General Store". We hope to see the final river bank reconstruction work done this fall along with the paved trail and amphitheater area. Thanks to all our financial supporters on this project. Be watching for an opening ceremony with a possible "naming" of the park.

BIKE PATH IMPROVEMENTS

The non-motorized bike paths around the Township are getting a maintenance boost with patching and repairs to the cracks and rough areas. Crews will be out through the end of October.
