CULTURAL AND ARTS CENTER ADDITION TO LIBRARY/COMMUNITY CENTER PLANNED

As work continues on construction of the Amy Van Andel Library and Community Center, a 5-6,000 square foot Cultural and Arts Center expansion of the 24,000 square foot building is being considered. After reviewing conceptual plans at a recent meeting and hearing expressions of confidence and support from fund-raising leadership, the Township Board approved moving ahead with additional design work on the addition.

The building expansion would provide space for larger public and private gatherings not possible in the small-group meeting rooms contained in the library. The additional space will be able to host groups of 150 in banquet table seating, and up to 250 people in theater-layout seating. The space will also be equipped to handle a variety of cultural and art events, such as dance, theatrical and music performances, art exhibits and other community events.

As this exciting work continues, we invite you to be a part of it as well! Donations for the Envision Ada initiative, which includes the Amy Van Andel Library and Community Center and the future Cultural and Arts Center, are still being accepted. We invite you to purchase a brick or paver to commemorate your charitable gift to this effort. ELECTIONS

2020 is looking to be a very big election year, with the following four elections:

- March 10 - Presidential Primary
- May 5 - bond issue for Northview Schools
- August 4 - primary election for all federal, state, and local races (excluding U.S. President)
- November 3 - general election

ARE YOU READY FOR REAL ID?

Starting October 1, 2020, you'll need a REAL ID-compliant document to fly in the U.S. and enter some federal facilities per federal law. You can obtain a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or state ID from the Michigan Secretary of State's office.

Bring these documents with you to a Secretary of State office the first time so you don't have to make multiple trips (refer to Michigan.gov/REALID):

- Your driver's license or state ID card
- Your certified birth certificate with a raised seal or stamp issued by a governmental agency; valid, unexpired U.S. passport; or an approved citizenship or legal presence document. (Faxes and photocopies won't be accepted.)
- If your name is different from what is on your birth certificate, bring certified documents, such as marriage licenses or court orders, for every time your name has changed.

Schedule an appointment to get your **REAL ID** at any Secretary of State office and get in and out in less than 30 minutes: Michigan.gov/SOSAppointments

ADA FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS –

FIRE ALARM SYSTEMS

Many homes in our coverage area have a monitored fire/burglar alarm system. These are great detection systems; however, they do require professional maintenance annually, at the least. We have found that many people have installed a system, but with a lack of proper maintenance we begin to get false alarms. In 2019 we responded to **85** false alarms – nearly 9% of all incidents. Even with a system a key holder is required to allow us access to verify the source of the alarm. Here are a few pointers for your system:

1. Annual maintenance, because even a spider web can give a false alarm.
2. Have a neighbor respond with a key if you are not in the area.
3. During construction, place the system in a test or silent mode. Drywall dust, new carpet odor, and paint fumes can set off an alarm.
4. Placement is important. Locations too near to a shower or kitchen can set off the alarm with steam.

BURN PERMITS

With springtime nearly upon us so is the opportunity to clean up the yard from downed branches and twigs. If you plan to burn your yard waste, remember a burn permit is required. To obtain one is a simple phone call to the Township office (616) 676-9191. Here are the guidelines: fires must be out by dark, means of extinguishment present, 50 feet from structures, and someone in attendance at all times.

Open burning is permitted throughout the Township until April 30th. From April 30 – November 1, burning is not permitted in the restricted area. (Restricted area is south of Fulton and west of the Grand River.)

CEMETERIES

Ada Township has two cemeteries – Ada Cemetery on Fulton Street and Findlay Cemetery on Two Mile Road. Burial and crematorium spaces are available for purchase by Ada Township residents only. Ada Cemetery is always open. Findlay Cemetery is open on Wednesdays and Fridays through Sundays, beginning April 1. When Spring weather improves, Township staff will be cleaning up winter debris and leftover gravesite materials. If you have items on your family's gravesite(s), please remove by April 1.

ADDRESS SIGNAGE

House numbers are required at or near the front door and must be a contrasting color from the home. Homes more than 90 feet from the road or not visible from the road require a sign at the roadway visible from both directions. On private drives, help us out and clearly mark your driveway from the private drive. Do you have questions about your home and our ability to locate it? Call us! We would be more than happy to answer questions or make a visit to assist you. The reflective green and white address signs you see around town are available from the fire department, and made while you wait. Fire Station One (616) 676-2376.



FIREFIGHTER RANDY WALTERS



On December 17, we lost one of our firefighters to cancer. Randy Walters was a paid, on-call member for Ada Township for nearly six years and brought to our department a lifetime of experience which he shared with our team. Randy began serving others as a paramedic with both Mercy and Life Ambulance. From there he worked at the Grand Rapids Fire Department for 15 years, retiring as Captain of EMS. He served in Afghanistan as a civilian working with our troops dealing in hazardous materials operations. He graduated from WMU as a physician assistant and continued that work until this past October. Randy was more than a firefighter. He tutored many of our members in both medical and firefighting and will be greatly missed by many in the fire and EMS community.

Permits are required for the installation of replacement furnaces and water heaters.

We have trained staff to inspect your new replacement furnace and water heater. An inspection ensures that the new equipment is safe and in compliance with the 2015 Michigan Residential Code.

Before signing a contract to have these items replaced, make sure that the contractor will obtain the necessary permits and coordinate inspection upon completion of the work.

Inspections cover important safety items like gas piping, venting and combustion air requirements.

Look familiar? Ada Lodge #280 F&AM on the corner of Ada Dr. and Bronson St. Note the Masonic symbol on the top front. Ada Masons first organized in 1869. Dues were 25¢ for the year. They met in the Ada Hotel and various locations before building this structure in 1910 for \$1,800. The Order of the Eastern Star shared the upstairs meeting room. Over the years, the site was also home to the Ada Post Office, Township offices, a library, events space, and even Amway's first warehouse. Today it is the western half of Schnitz Ada Grill and Grand Rapids Bicycle Co.

SPRING LEAF PICK-UP

Spring leaf pick-up will be held on **Tuesday, April 14** and **Tuesday, May 12** this year. This pick-up is available to residents with houses south of Fulton and west of the Grand River. Residents **must** use the special Ada Township leaf bags which are available to purchase at the Ada Township Hall Treasurer's Office for .75 cents per bag.

When you make a leaf bag purchase, you are put on "the list" for the pick-up service (for the current season). If you are going to be using leaf bags from last season, it is recommended to call Ada Township at (616) 676-9191, Ext. 27, to request a pick-up this year.

WHERE: Forest Hills Central Middle School parking lot
ONE WAY ENTRY FROM ADA DRIVE, EXIT HALL DRIVE.
Enter via Ada Drive near Alta Dale by Central Middle School.

WHAT: Non-hazardous household waste, appliances, scrap metal, electronics for recycling (computers, TVs, etc.), household items for re-use, office paper for shredding.

NO YARD WASTE. You will need to use leaf pick-up day, your curb side service or other source for yard waste such as leaves, branches and brush.

NO HAZARDOUS MATERIAL. Paint (open and dried paint cans okay), cleaners, batteries, and hazardous material will not be accepted. Check www.reimaginetrash.org for Kent County options and details.

LEGACY PARK – In Memory of Helen and Rich DeVos

Formally dedicated last May, the new park in Ada Village is in its final stages. Please be careful while construction continues and supervise children in the playground and near the river.

A Memorial Sculpture was donated by the DeVos family and constructed last fall. Some lawn recovery will take place in the spring.

The new "Van Andel Family Pavillion" and landscape around it will also be finished up in the spring. Thanks to Dave and Carol Van Andel for their generous donation.

ROSELLE PARK

The park has been flooded several times in the past year, impacting access to the trails. We are still planning to do improvements to the non-paved trails in the north section of the park next summer, weather permitting.

The park had a lot of damage from the storm in September. We have repaired the silo and cleared the trails, but there is still some tree work needed.

Reservations for rental of the room in the new building are open. Residents should plan ahead since popular dates are filling in. Guidelines for use and fees are available on-line or through the Park office.

ADA TOWNSHIP PARK
