NEW ORGANIZATION TO SUPPORT VILLAGE REDEVELOPMENT

A new organization called Envision Ada will be charged with helping the Township and DDA accomplish its redevelopment plans for the Ada Village area that resulted from the community-led planning process in 2013. The group will play an active role in organizing and promoting Village events and festivals, in conjunction with existing community organizations. Envision Ada also will lead a community fundraising effort to raise \$3 million in private funds to support public infrastructure improvements.

The group ultimately aims to serve as a means for community members to join together in various committees to help organize and implement items of interest. The Township will be transferring responsibility for the EnvisionAda.com website and Envision Ada social media channels to the new organization.

Construction of public infrastructure, including the reconstruction of Headley Street, is scheduled to begin in the spring of 2015. Planning efforts by the Township Board, DDA and supporting groups will be ongoing through the fall and winter in anticipation of this start date.

A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER...

Winter tax bills will be mailed around November 28, 2014. If you do not receive it, please call our office to obtain another copy. All tax payments are due in our office by 5:00pm, Tuesday, February 17, 2015. Remember **POSTMARKS ARE NOT ACCEPTED** as date received. After March 1, 2015 all unpaid real property taxes will be turned over to the Kent County Treasurers Office for collection.

The usual payment options still apply; by mail, in person, or by credit card (*see the reverse side of your tax bill for instructions*). Any payments made by credit/debit card will be charged a fee of **3% of the tax bill**. Additionally, you may sign up for ACH electronic payments. Forms must be returned 15 days before payment is due. Please contact our office for more information about ACH. If you do your banking on-line, ***please allow a minimum of 10 business days*** for payment to reach us. As stated we do not accept postmarks or check dates as date received. We are not responsible for the date of delivery by the United States Postal Service.

Since our office will be closed December 31, 2014 thru January 4, 2015, all tax payments left in our drop box will be considered as "PAID" December 31, 2014.

Please do not include any other Township payments with your tax payment. Thank you.

CONDITIONAL RESCISSION OF PRINCIPAL RESIDENCE EXEMPTION (PRE)

A conditional rescission allows an owner to receive a PRE on his or her current property and on previously exempted property simultaneously if the previous principal residence (all must apply):

- **is not occupied**
- **is for sale**
- **is not leased**
- **is not used for any business or commercial purpose.**

To apply for a conditional rescission, the owner must submit a Conditional Rescission of Principal Residence Exemption form to the local assessor in which the property is located on or before May 1 of the **FIRST** year of the claim.

An owner may receive the PRE on the previous principal residence for up to three years if the criteria are met. The owner must annually submit the form on or before **DECEMBER 31** to verify to the assessor that the property for which the PRE is retained is not occupied, is for sale, is not leased, and is not used for any business or commercial purpose.

SHOP WITH A SHERIFF



Christmas is fast approaching and this is our 11th year hosting the The Shop with a Sheriff program. The program was created to help families that are struggling get much needed items for their kids at Christmas. The families that participate in this program get a one on one experience with a Sheriff's deputy. The child or children are paired with a Deputy and that Deputy walks through the store and helps the child select from items on a list provided by mom or dad. The list contains some needed items such as hats, coats and seasonal clothing. We also make some wiggle room so the child can pick out something they choose, such as a toy. The Deputies that have participated in the program return year after year. It is such a positive and exciting time for all individuals involved. The children really enjoy having personal contact with law enforcement, and we can see the confidence build from having new clothes and toys that they picked out.

This program exists all based on donations from the community. Many businesses and individuals have helped this program succeed for many years. KEEPING OUR WATERWAYS CLEAN



The number one source of pollutants to West Michigan waterways is no longer large, industrial sources. It is the rainwater that cannot soak into the ground that instead runs off hard surfaces such as roads, parking lots, and rooftops, and enters our local waterways. As this “stormwater runoff” flows over the ground, it picks up road salts, oils and grease, lawn chemicals, bacteria, and soil particles, and carries these pollutants into storm drains or directly into our lakes, rivers, and streams. Our water resources suffer from decreased water quality, streambank erosion, and in some cases unnatural warming that is bad for the fish and insects that live in the water.

However, there are a number of things that landowners can do to reduce the impact of stormwater on local waterways. Low impact development (LID) practices are designed to help rainwater soak into the ground closer to where it falls, limiting the polluted runoff that reaches our lakes, rivers, and streams. LID practices include things such as rain barrels, rain gardens, green roofs or live walls, and porous pavement.

The practices described above are most applicable to the more densely-developed, “urban” portions of the Township. However, property owners and developers in the more rural areas of the Township can also implement practices to help protect water quality and the integrity of small streams. These include reducing the area of manicured lawns in favor of maintaining native vegetation, maintaining or re-establishing natural vegetation along stream corridors, and avoiding vegetation disturbance and excavation on steep slopes in proximity to waterways. It might not seem obvious, but, you are an important link in the local food movement. Our Market is an essential part of food security for the area. Your choice to shop at the Market ensures the farmers and other folks who produce market goods have a dependable source of income.

As conditions drive folks to look for locally produced consumables, the Ada Farmer's Market should be the first stop. The area's top producers are here every Tuesday – both organic and conventional. In addition, we have a high demand for space from vendors with other great products, giving us many unique choices to round out the product mix. In the

height of summer, we try to include as many of these vendors, making your visit to the Market just a little different each time. Don't see a favorite product or vendor? We are happy to reach out to any producer and invite them to try us out.

The Market is also about personal connections between the growers and their customers. Walk through any Tuesday and you'll hear many leisurely conversations taking place between these groups. Yes, the food producers really do know about their customer's families; how many are in school, if a loved one is not well, where they have been on vacation. And these same customers know just as much about their favorite vendors.

Shoppers also know a lot about the food they are buying at market. They will ask - and get a response - on the exact freshness of a purchase. Very likely the answer confirms it was picked that morning or the day before. The taste of products bought at market confirms this quality. It's fresh taste. No long interstate trip or longer wait before reaching the consumer. No extra packaging – it goes from the vendor's display to your basket.

If you are a regular buyer at the Market, you can help spread our fresh message with your friends and neighbors. Surprisingly, many local community members are still not aware there is a farmer's market in Ada! We open from the first weeks of June through the end of October, each Tuesday, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

And keep posted to our website (adafarmersmarket.com) along with our Facebook and Twitter sites. Take a peek right now! Look for recipes and any Market updates. Keeping engaged with your market will help us bring it to life every year with the best of fresh.

Last, but certainly not least, it was another great year at the Ada Farmer's Market – in spite of the abnormally wet Tuesdays! A test run of the Chef in the Market program was well received and we are looking to expand it in a big way next year. Another exciting event on the horizon is the creation of a new, permanent structure for the Market. Park Hours: Parks and Preserves grounds are open to the public dawn to dusk, seven days a week.

Dog Policy: Township ordinances require dogs to be on a leash and cleaned up after in all parks.

Motorized recreation vehicles are not allowed.

Ada Park Shelter & Gazebo Rentals and Reservations: Available April through October. For rates, availability, use policies or reservations, contact the Park office. 2015 reservation will begin after December 1st.

Softball & Athletic Fields: At Ada Park and Leonard Field are available seasonally. They are often scheduled for leagues and instructional programs. Contact the Park office for information, schedules or reservations.

Basketball & Tennis Courts at Ada Park are open to the public except during scheduled lessons and programs. Tennis Courts #5 and #6 are set up for Pickle Ball.



“Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan”

Your Input is Requested

Ada Township is in the process of updating the 5-year master plan for our parks, trails, recreation programs and open space preserves. This includes specific goals related to these areas and a financial plan to reach them. A copy of our last plan is available on the parks page of the Township web site. This November, a public input survey went out and an Input Session was held for comments. Around mid-January a draft of the new plan will be available on line for your review and comments. Additional comments may be sent directly to the Park office.

Update on Ada Township Parks

Ada Township Park:

The Shelter and large Gazebo at Ada Township Park are closed for the winter. They will reopen in late March. Shelter and Gazebo rentals will be available April through October in 2015. Contact the park office for reservations.

Roselle Park: Cross Country Ski trails will again be available on the non-paved trails in the North section of Roselle Park. We do not have a groomer yet so the conditions will be based on the weather. We ask that walkers, runners and dogs stay to the side of the x-c ski tracks on the trails. The main paved trail loop will be cleared of snow as often as possible to keep it open for walkers and runners.



Plans are still underway for a resource building to be constructed in the park near the Michigan Street entrance. The building’s conceptual design is available at the park office for review. More details soon.

Leonard Field Park:

The Ice Rink at Leonard Field will be set up again. Note that ice conditions are totally dependent on the weather and vary daily. Check with the Park office as needed.

Carl Creek Crossing Preserve

Trails will be mostly closed for the winter. Construction of a new trail system, parking area, boardwalk and foot-bridge will begin in the spring.
