BURN PERMITS NOW AVAILABLE BY PHONE

Burn Permits can be issued at the Township Hall in person or over the phone Monday - Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. You must speak with a person to obtain the permit, and it will not be valid if left on voicemail. The permits will be valid for Monday - Thursday or Friday - Sunday, depending on the day issued.

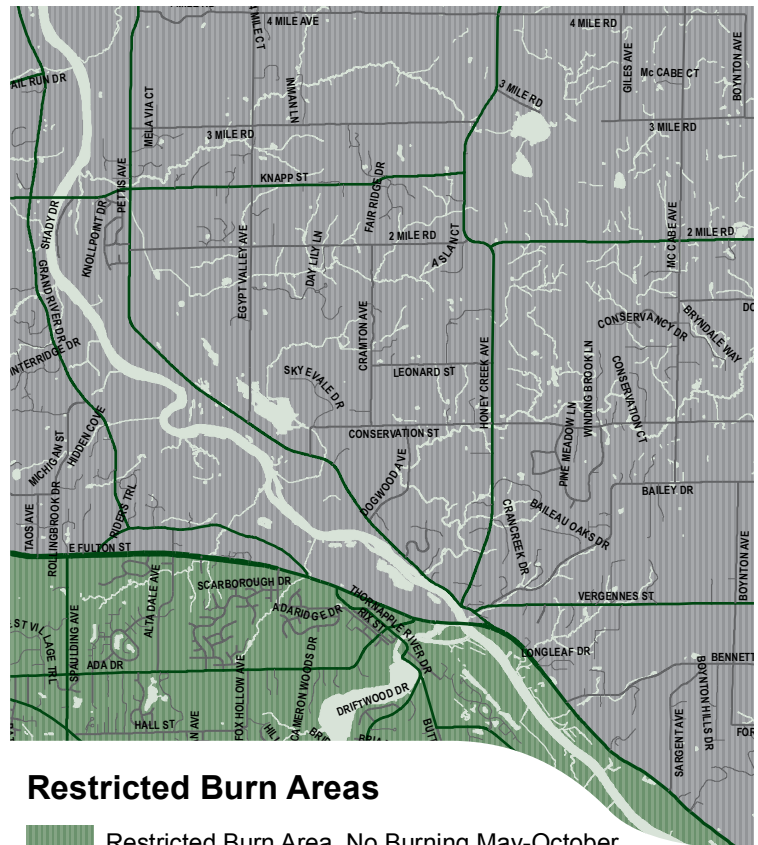

Summary of Rules:

- The fire must be attended by an adult at all times
- The fire must be completely out at dusk
- The fire cannot be for waste disposal
- The fire must be at least 50 feet from any structure
- A method of extinguishing the fire must be present
- The smoke must not offend neighbors

TOWNSHIP ACQUIRES OPEN SPACE ON CARL CREEK

Under the auspices of its Open Space Preservation Program, Ada Township recently closed on the acquisition of 2.5 acres of land with over 500 feet of frontage on both sides of Carl Creek, for the purpose of permanently preserving the property in a natural condition. The property, acquired from Robin and Carlene Botttrall, is located on the south side of Grand River Dr., opposite the road from the Township's covered bridge on the non-motorized trail that crosses the creek.

Carl Creek originates in wetland areas along Spaulding Ave., south of the railroad tracks, and flows to the east and north to its outlet on the Grand River. The Carl Creek watershed includes significant wetland areas, as well as a large amount of developed residential and industrial land. The Township previously acquired the Carl Creek Wetland Preserve, which is 34 acres of wooded land and wetland adjacent to the creek on the west side of Alta Dale Ave., north of the rail line.

Both of these property acquisitions are intended to protect the integrity of the Carl Creek channel and water quality in the creek, by preserving natural buffers along the creek and protecting against additional impervious surfaces in proximity to the creek.

Immediate plans for the recently-acquired property call for a single-family home on the site to be demolished. Longer term, the Township may install a low impact nature trail and small parking area on the property, so that residents may access and enjoy the creek and its natural surroundings.

The \$60,000 purchase was paid for with funds from the voter-approved Parks and Land Preservation millage.

SENIORS AND DISABLED CITIZENS OF ADA TOWNSHIP

Please take note: you can apply for a deferment for 2011 summer tax if your household income **did not** exceed \$40,000 for the preceding calendar year and you meet at least one of the following requirements:

- You are 62 years or older
- Paraplegic or Quadriplegic
- Eligible serviceperson, veteran widow or widower
- Blind person
- Totally and permanently disabled

JULY BOARD OF REVIEW

The Ada Township Board of Review will be meeting in July to review petitions for late filed Principal Residence Exemptions for owners that owned and occupied their residence prior to May 1st. One way to check that you have the principal residence exemption is on your tax bill that will be mailed out the first week of July. If you have 100% exemption, the tax amount on the "School Operating" line will be "0". If you have purchased a piece of vacant land that is contiguous to your principal residence, the vacant parcel is also eligible for the principal residence exemption. If you qualify for the exemption and it is not reflected on your summer tax bill, please call the Assessing Department at 676-9191, ext 26.

MAILING ADDRESS UPDATES

Please contact our offices within 30 days after a change of address occurs so we may update our information. Our office provides all entities with correct mailing addresses. Correct information will help us keep postage costs down and make sure you are notified of any township information. Our phone number is 676-9191, ext 26.

TAX PAYMENT METHODS

Tax bills are scheduled to be mailed out the last week of June. These bills are due by September 14, 2011, 5:00 p.m. Remember the Township DOES NOT accept postmarks as date received. You have several options in paying your bill:

- As always you may come into the Township offices Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. except for holidays when the offices are closed. There is a drive-up drop box located at the end of the sidewalk at the Thornapple River Dr entrance to the Township offices.
- You can sign up for ACH, which allows the Township's bank to deduct payment from your bank. Call our offices for more information. Forms are also available on our website.
- You can also make payments with a credit card either by phone (800) 272-9829 or log onto our website: www.adatownshipmi.com See the back of tax bill for further instructions. There is a fee of 3% of the tax bill charged by the credit card clearinghouse. **CREDIT CARDS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT THE TOWNSHIP OFFICES.**
- You can mail your payment to our office by using the enclosed envelope. **REMEMBER THAT POSTMARKS ARE NOT ACCEPTED AS DATE RECEIVED. ALL PAYMENTS MUST BE IN OUR OFFICE BY SEPTEMBER 14, 2011, 5:00 p.m. TO BE CONSIDERED ON TIME.**
- The Township does accept partial payments after July 1st when tax bills are released. Appropriate interest/penalties will apply to the unpaid balance after September 14th.

BIKE SAFETY TIPS

Here are some major bike safety tips that are repeatedly violated throughout the East Precinct:

- **Ride with traffic;** Always be aware of the traffic around you and be prepared to stop.
- Ride **single file** in a straight line when riding on the road.
- Always **obey traffic signals;** Learn the rules of the road and obey traffic laws.

Here are some Pedestrian Safety tips. Please abide by them to make your walk safer and your neighbors happier.

Follow these Pedestrian Safety Tips When Walking Near Traffic.

Now that the weather is nice you see a lot of people walking in the roadway. The problem is that when they walk with other people they walk three and four abreast and this cuts into the traveled portion of the roadway for motor vehicles. This can be very dangerous, especially when two vehicles pass each other, all in the same spot.

Vehicles have the right of way and that is a dangerous practice forcing vehicles in to the opposing lane. Citizens walking have to give way to motor vehicles.

- **Use sidewalks** whenever available.
- **Obey traffic signals.**
- **Cross streets at a corner.** Most pedestrians are struck when crossing somewhere other than an intersection.
- **Look left-right-left before crossing a street** and continue looking while crossing.
- **Make eye contact with drivers prior to crossing in front of them.** Don't assume that because you can see the driver, the driver can see you.
- If you must walk along the roadway, **walk facing traffic** as far to the left as possible.
- If you must walk at night or in the early morning, **wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight.** Most pedestrian deaths occur between 6 p.m. and midnight.
- **Older adults need to allow for enough time** to safely cross the street.
- **Never allow children under 10 to cross streets alone.** Young children do not have the skills to accurately judge traffic risks.

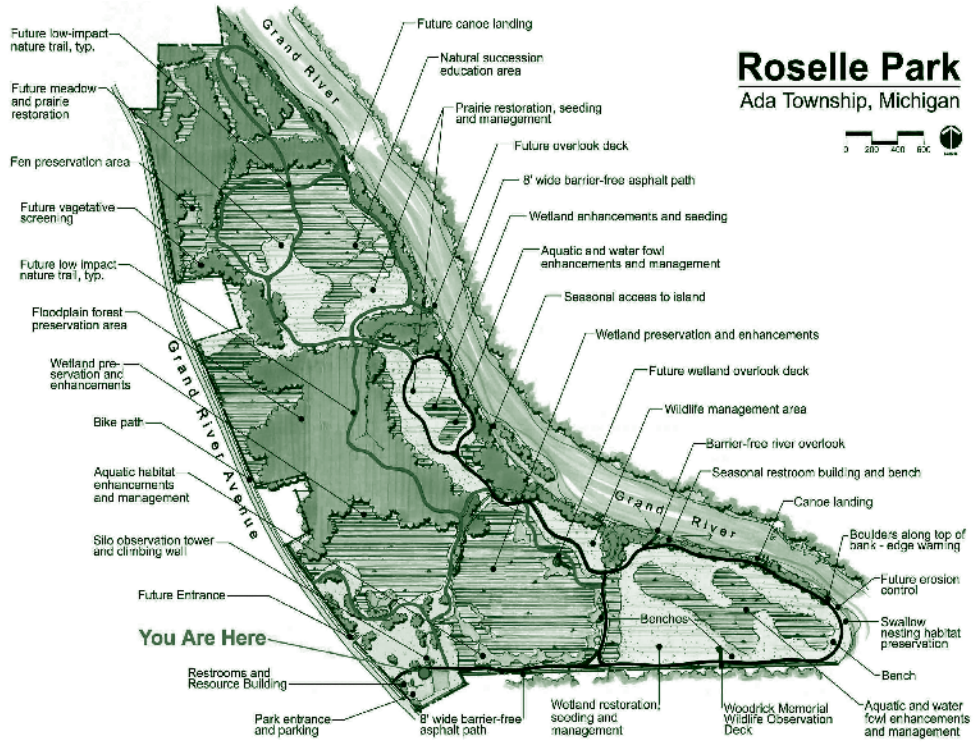
